Audio Retrieval Network Wiring and Backbone

The audio retrieval network will be used in 32 courtrooms and shall provide applications for network management for digital recording, redundant recorded audio file storage, playback, transcription, conversion of audio to multiple file formats, file distribution, archiving and file management functions of courtroom proceedings. The audio retrieval system shall be wireless for the (8) portable ADA compliant hearing assist systems.

Some monies will be set aside in the event unforeseen conditions arise in the installation of the wireless system or the audio retrieval network.

The funds to perform the above mentioned item will not require additional appropriations but will come from savings incurred from the project budget.



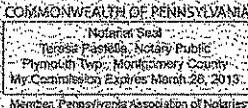


